<u>Consideration of and Take Possible Action regarding line extension from Silo</u>
<u>Elementary School to Church Rd:</u> Field Superintendent Pearce informed the Board that this property has already been platted for 6 houses. We have the materials in stock for this line extension, if the developer will provide the labor. Motion by Director Butlan, 2nd by Treasurer Henderson, Yes by Vice-Chairperson Smith, Secretary Hoefer, Assist. Sec-Treas Bourne, Director Rudolf and Chairperson Lewis to provide materials.

Consideration of and Take Possible Action regarding line upgrade on north side of Hwy 70 from Taste Island to 49th St. – Dale Goad pay for labor, and we provide materials (already purchased): Field Superintendent Pearce informed the Board that the drawings were for a 6", which will not provide accurate fire protection. Engineer Henderson recommends that they run a 10" all the way to the 8" but nothing inside the industrial park. We have the materials for this upgrade in stock if they will provide the labor. Motion by Treasurer Henderson, 2nd by Director Butlan, Yes by Vice-Chairperson Smith, Secretary Hoefer, Assist. Sec-Treas Bourne, Director Rudolf, and Chairperson Lewis to move forward with the line upgrade and we provide materials.

Lead Plant Operator Brown informed the Board that the backwash lagoons at the Water Plant need to be dredged. Mark Shelton with the Choctaw Nation called him a few days ago and stated that there is supposed to be a State Bill putting a moratorium on dredging until 2028. Field Superintendent Pearce and Manager Clinton stated that we already have a permit for distributing the sludge and that it will just need to be updated. The Board agreed to move forward with getting permits up to dates and getting quotes.
